PURPOSE OF THIS EDITION

To provide an overview of construction activities and their impacts for the month of May.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN MAY

ROAD CLOSURES AND DETOURS

University Avenue between 39 St and Collegiate Rd is now closed to facilitate the 2019 construction program. Pedestrian, cyclist and vehicular detours will be in place until the re-opening in mid-October.

Collegiate Rd between Physical Plant Rd and University Avenue is now closed to complete deep utility upgrades. Pedestrian, cyclist and vehicular detours will be in place until the re-opening in August.

CAPELLA

Work is now underway with deep utility installation on this site. Impacts will be minor and shouldn't result in any impact to surrounding areas.

CAMBRIDGE MANOR AND MAPLE


Vertical construction, exterior work and framing continues on these sites. Continued construction related traffic and intermittent lane closures will occur during this work. Please watch for signage.

RHAPSODY

Vertical construction, final concrete pouring and backfilling continue to be the focus on this worksite. Intermittent lane closures to facilitate these activities will occur throughout the month. Signage will be in place during closures.

AUGUST AND ALT HOTEL

Parkade excavation and construction is progressing to slab pouring this month. This activity will result in increased construction traffic on University Avenue but is not expected to result in any intermittent lane closures.
